<p>Key concepts: cause, change, continuity, king, monarchy, public, queen, society.</p>		<p>Explain and summarise any major changes in my local area.</p>	<p>Year 1: looking at homes and clues for age of buildings; the change from wood to brick being a safety aspect.</p>
<p>Know that Hoddesdon has an Anglo-Saxon heritage.</p> <p>Know that the first record of the town is in the Domesday book (more will be learnt about this in Normans topic) in 1086 as a large village - Hoddas’Dun (Hodda’s Hill). The population was 300-350 then which was larger than other villages.</p> <p>Know that the town was granted a market charter by King Henry III in 1253 after the residents wrote requesting this. This meant that the town could hold a weekly market and an annual fair.</p> <p>Know that the town developed as a stagecoach stop with many inns, as it was on a main route into London. The town greatly enlarged in the time of Elizabeth I and some of the existing inns date back to this time. These were mostly used by the middle and upper classes.</p> <p>Know that the building of Broxbourne railway in 1840 ended the dominance of stagecoaches in the town.</p> <p>Know that the Clock Tower was built in 1835, and the War Memorial in 1921.</p> <p>Know that Rye House was once a large manor house and was one of the first brick buildings in the country. It was made of brick to show how expensive it was. Now only the gatehouse remains. It was the childhood home of Catherine Parr, Henry VIII’s 6th queen after her father died. It is a Grade 1 listed house.</p> <p>Know that in 1623 there was a conspiracy to assassinate King Charles II and his brother, the Duke of York. The plotters planned to hide in the grounds of the house and ambush the King on the way back from racing at Newmarket.
